The California State Sea Grant Fellowship and the John A. Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship provide a unique educational experience to students who have an interest in marine/ocean/Great Lakes resources and in the national policy decisions affecting those resources.

The Knauss Marine Fellows, sponsored by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), are hosted in the legislative or the executive branches of the federal government, or in appropriate associations/institutions located in the Washington, D.C. area for a one-year paid research slot. Hosting agencies can include the EPA, NOAA, NSF, US Dept of State, US Fish & Wildlife, and the Dept of the Navy. Fellows are fully paid, and receive additional funding for travel, relocation costs and health insurance.

The California Sea Grant State Fellowship is similar in nature to the Knauss, with the exception that students are placed with California state agencies, legislators or researchers at selected universities and institutions.
